THIRD SUNDAY OF EASTER

*The disciples recognized the Lord Jesus
in the breaking of the bread, alleluia.*

On most Sundays during the Easter season in Cycle A, our Gospel is taken from the Gospel of John. This week's Gospel, however, is taken from the Gospel of Luke. As in last week's Gospel, today's Gospel shows us how the first community of disciples came to believe that Jesus had risen from the dead. In these stories we gain insight into how the community of the Church came to be formed. When we read today's Gospel, we may be surprised to learn that these friends of Jesus could walk and converse with him at some length yet not recognize him. We discover that the risen Jesus is not always easily recognized. Cleopas and the other disciple walk with a person whom they believe to be a stranger; only later do they discover that the stranger is Jesus. We learn that the first community met and recognized Jesus in the breaking of the bread, just as we meet Jesus in the Eucharist. They are leaving their community in Jerusalem. Their friend Jesus has been crucified. Their hope is gone. Jesus himself approaches the two men, but they take him for a stranger. Jesus asks them what they are discussing. He invites them to share their experience and interpretation of the events surrounding his crucifixion and death. When the two disciples have done so, Jesus offers his own interpretation of his crucifixion and resurrection, citing Jewish Scripture. In that encounter we find the model for our Liturgy of the Word—what we do each time we gather as a community for the Eucharist. We gather together to break open the Word of God. In the next part of the story, we find a model for our Liturgy of the Eucharist. The disciples invite Jesus to stay with them. During the meal in which they share in the breaking of the bread, the disciples' eyes are opened; they recognize the stranger as Jesus. In the Eucharist too we share in the breaking of the bread and discover Jesus in our midst. Just as the disciples returned to Jerusalem to recount their experience to the other disciples, we too are sent from our Eucharistic gathering. Our experience of Jesus in the Eucharist compels us to share the story with others.

Second Collection Next Weekend The mosaic work of the central Trinity Domes of the Basilica of the National Shrine of the Immaculate Conception in Washington, DC, is being completed to prepare for the 100th anniversary of the placing of the foundation stone in 2020. This is a monumental undertaking for which the Bishops of the United States have approved a special one-time collection to take place next weekend May 7 & 8. This great Marian Shrine exists today because of the historic generosity of American Catholics and clergy, the prayers of the faithful and the hard work of the artisans and laborers who began building it nearly one hundred years ago.

Cemetery Reminder

- Artificial flowers are not permitted during grass cutting season.
 - No fence, gravel, bark, or other foreign objects are permitted.
 - Planting flowers must not exceed more than 1 foot in front of the headstone.
 - The cemetery reserves the right to remove grave ornamentation which become unsightly or a danger to lawn cutters.
 - The cemetery care givers will level and seed all graves.
 - It can take anywhere from 3-9 months for a grave to settle. Once the grave has, a care giver will repair the grave.
 - Please know that it is the responsibility of the family to have the headstone reset through the monument company.
- These are not new rules in the cemeteries. We continually remind you so that our cemeteries are a safe and serene environment.**
